"The Word in the World" Devotional Sharing

A testimony that God is real My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you.

The first passage of Scripture God graciously given to me was Psalm 29:10–11: "The Lord sits enthroned over the flood; the Lord is enthroned as King forever. The Lord gives strength to his people; the Lord blesses his people with peace."

When the consultant neurologist told me on 23 March 2026 that I would need to undergo two brain operations between April and May to remove my meningioma, I couldn't help to feel some anxiety and unease. However, when I returned home from the hospital, God immediately spoke to me in His own way, saying: "Do not worry. God understands your situation, and He will help you." The timely and promising words from the Heavenly Father brought me immense comfort, assurance, hope, and peace. Praise and thanks be to the Lord!

I thank the Lord for His abundant grace and favour in guiding the doctors and protecting me, enabling me to safely and successfully undergo two brain operations over the 30 days from mid-April to mid-May. In fact, there were three operations in total. The first one, a shunt procedure, failed and proved ineffective. I even suffered a cerebral haemorrhage. How grateful I am to the Lord for His grace and mercy, the cerebral haemorrhage suddenly stopped and He saved me from danger. Just as it is written in Scripture Psalm 23:4: "Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me." I thank the Lord for His abundant grace and mercy, which enabled me to pass through this crisis safely. In the weeks following the two brain drainage operations done on 13th and 15th April, I lost part of my memory. I could only write my own name. My legs were unable to walk. I required the nurses' care for everything whilst in hospital. Suddenly, I felt that I were nearing the end of my life. I had even prepared two of my favourite hymns to be sung when I rested in the Lord's embrace. I sang them every day, believing in my heart that I was about to see the Lord's face. One night, a verse from the Bible came to my mind - Job 1:21: "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked I will depart. The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; may the name of the Lord be praised." At that moment, I realised that all the grace and blessings in my life were not to be taken for granted. They were all given to me through the abundant grace of God the Father. Therefore, I must learn to be grateful and to revere the Almighty Lord.

On 12 May, the doctor spent about five hours performing surgery to remove my meningioma. As the incisions from the three operations were at the back of my head, the doctor instructed me to ensure the wounds did not swell or bleed. I found it very difficult to sleep and had to be extremely careful. It was certainly no easy task. However, during this time, I was so grateful for the Lord's protection. His presence with me made me experience the heavenly peace and strength.

God graciously granted me a second promise from Scripture Deuteronomy 33:25: "... your strength will equal your days."

God's works are mighty and marvellous. The Holy Spirit enlightened and comforted me whether I was in hospital, in nursing home or back at home and in everything I did. God's power was made perfect in my weakness, and His grace was sufficient for me. During this month or so from the hospital to the nursing home, the loving care I received from the doctors and nurses has made me deeply sense the gracious hand of our Heavenly Father watching over me, helping me and accompanying me. It evokes a deep sense of praise and touch within my heart.

A week before my discharge, the nursing home assessed me to be discharged on 2 June. At the same time, they arranged for a carer, provided free of charge by the government, to visit my home for 45 minutes every day after my discharge. The carer would help me wash hair, bathing and prepare breakfast as I sometimes lost balance and my legs were weak. I am so grateful to the Lord for giving me such immeasurable grace and mercy. However, a few days before my discharge on 2 June, I began to sense the power of God's healing within me, that gradually restored my physical strength. On the second day after returning home, I personally experienced the mighty and marvellous miracle of the Lord Jesus, who healed me Himself (Miracle: This refers to an event intended to reveal a deeper truth to people. BSF). Just as it is written in the Bible Isaiah 53:5: "But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed". The Lord's presence and power enabled me to regain my strength and move about freely. That very day, I went out for lunch and shopping with my family, and did household chores. My family and I were all overjoyed and grateful to the Lord for giving us the opportunity to personally witness the Lord Jesus's gospel from the heavenly peace. His promised words and His mighty healing power were so very real. It also allowed me to come to a deeper understanding of and experience the risen Lord. I give thanks and praise to the Lord.

Just as the mountains surround Jerusalem, so God's loving-kindness surrounds me.

I thank the Lord for His grace in guiding me with cords of love and tenderness over the past few years, enabling me to get to know many pastors, brothers and sisters in the Lord. We have had the opportunity to serve God together in missionary and prayer ministries. During my surgery, they prayed for me ceaselessly and kept watch over me. Many sisters fasted and prayed for me (some of them even took turns fasting for whole days) for over a month, filling my heart with boundless gratitude. Such marvellous grace has come upon one as ordinary and unworthy as myself. Moreover, Pastor Huang, the Senior Pastor of my church, King's Cross Methodist Church in London, visited me in hospital on numerous occasions. Each time, he administered Holy Communion for me and led my husband and me in singing, praying and worshipping the Lord. He cared for me deeply and led the brothers and sisters in the church to remember me in their prayers with love and to walk alongside me. I am so grateful to them. At the same time, I am deeply grateful to my family for their meticulous care, companionship and concern, which have allowed me to truly understand the saying "True friendship is revealed in times of adversity.". Surrounded by everyone's loving care, I have experienced the self-sacrificing, selfless love that comes from the Lord Jesus. I am deeply moved by the Lord's grace.

I returned to the church on 7 June to attend the Sunday service. When Pastor Huang, brothers and sisters saw me unexpectedly in the church, they were a little surprised initially, but then became very happy and grateful. Some of the sisters even embraced me. It was a deeply moving scene, and their love touched my heart deeply. Finally, I ascribe all the glory, praise and power to the One who loves us so deeply ... our Saviour, Jesus Christ, from this time forth and for evermore. Amen!
